

Plant of the Month April 2024: Lungwort or Bethlehem Sage/ Pulmonaria sp.



Are you looking for some early colour in your garden? Lungwort comes in a variety of shades of blue and pink, and with its equally attractive leaves will brighten up your spring garden. When flowering is over it will also provide an attractive groundcover.

Growing Conditions:

Sun: Light to full shade
Water: Needs rich, moist soil, and prefers a neutral pH.
Maintenance: Low, but make sure it is watered in dry periods
Tolerates: dryer conditions but may go dormant
Zone: 4-8

Description / Characteristics:

Height x Spread: The flower stems are 15-30cm tall, and the plant can gradually spread to 30-45cm.

Bloom time and description: April-May. Bunches of bell-shaped flowers with 5 petals rising above the basal leaves. Come in a variety of blue, pinks and purples. Basal foliage has attractive white blotches.

Fruit: n/a

Attracts: Bees and other insects

Pests & Disease: Can be prone to both slugs and powdery mildew

Propagation: Best propagated through root division

Special value: Bees and other pollinators
